

Cookie Policy (United Kingdom)

This Cookie Policy was last updated on 6th January 2026 and applies to citizens and legal permanent residents of the United Kingdom.

Introduction

This Cookie Policy explains how we use cookies and similar technologies on our website. It applies to users located in the United Kingdom and is based on the UK General Data Protection Regulation (UK GDPR) and the Privacy and Electronic Communications Regulations (PECR).

You can manage your cookie preferences at any time using the information in this policy.

What Are Cookies?

Cookies are small, simple text files that are placed on your device when you visit a website. They are then stored on your browser or the hard drive of your computer or other device. They allow the website to recognise your device and store certain information about your preferences or past actions. The information stored therein may be returned to the servers of the relevant third parties during subsequent visits.

Cookies may be set by us ("first-party cookies") or by third parties whose services we use ("third-party cookies").

Types of Cookies We Use

We group cookies into the following categories:

Essential Cookies

These cookies enable core functionality such as security, verification of identity and network management. These cookies can't be disabled.

Marketing Cookies

These cookies are used to track advertising effectiveness to provide a more relevant service and deliver better ads to suit your interests. We use Google Analytics cookies which collect anonymous data on how many users visit the site, which pages are visited, time spent on each page, etc. We only use this data for statistical purposes, and cannot tell who you are or link data back to a specific username.

Functional Cookies

These cookies collect data to remember choices users make to give a more personalised experience.

Analytics Cookies

These cookies help us to understand how visitors interact with our website, discover errors and improve our site.

Consent

Your Data Protection Rights

Under the UK GDPR, you have the right to know why your personal data is needed, what will happen to it, and how long it will be retained for. This includes:

- › Right of access: You have the right to access your personal data that is known to us.
- › Right to rectification: You have the right to supplement, correct, have deleted or blocked your personal data whenever you wish.
- › Right to consent: If you give us your consent to process your data, you have the right to change your mind and revoke that consent.
- › Right to object: You may object to the processing of your data. We will comply with this, unless there are justified grounds for processing.
- › Request data portability: You have the right to request all your personal data from the controller and transfer it in its entirety to another controller.
- › Right of complaint: Lodge a complaint with the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO).
